National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day

April 30th is **National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day**, which aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications.

To aid in this campaign, **WCPL** will be distributing **Deterra bags** for free, from April 18th through April 30th, at all locations. These bags can be used to safely dispose of unneeded prescription medication. Here is more information about how to safely dispose of these meds at other times.

SAFE DRUG DISPOSAL

The **Medway Drug Enforcement** agency has placed metal receptacles in the lobby of the Justice Center and at local police stations in Brunswick, Creston, Doylestown, Millersburg, Orrville, Rittman, Shreve and Smithville.

Citizens can now safely dispose of unneeded prescription medication without waiting for an annual "drug take-back day."

If you have such medication, please remove the label from the containers and feel free to dispose of this medication at any one of the above locations, 24-hours per day, with no questions asked.

Upon removal from the secure receptacle, the drugs are incenerated.



Syringes and loose medications are **not** accepted.

Please ensure your medication is in a proper container.
