Tuesday, May 3 at 2 PM

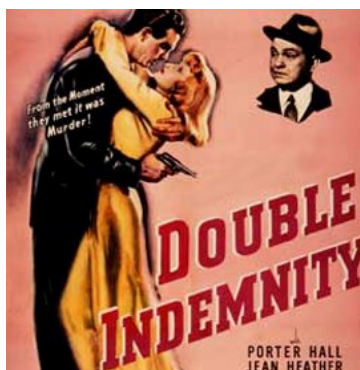

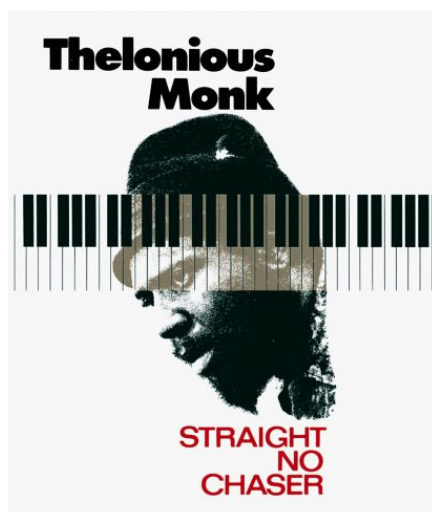


### Music Movie Matinee: *Thelonious Monk: Straight, No Chaser (1988)*
